


Research Methodology

- Poll of 4092 GB adults, sampled and weighted to be politically and demographically representative.
- Fieldwork: 15 21 January 2016
- Carried out online using the YouGov panel.

Because I've been inspired/encouraged by major sporting events (e.g. 2012 **1%**


London Olympics/ Paralympics)

How often and why people DO NOT exercise?




29%	Because I am not (physically) strong enough




















